The Waterways Regulation Program (WRP) has received the application of Boston Tea Party Ship, Inc. requesting authorization to perform certain activities in state waterways located in Boston pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 91, the Public Waterfront Act and its regulations at 310 CMR 9.0 etc. The WRP has assigned this application filing with the above-referenced Waterways License application number. IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT YOU REFER TO THIS APPLICATION NUMBER WHENEVER YOU SUBMIT OR REQUEST INFORMATION FOR THIS FILE. Upon review of this application, the WRP has made a determination that this project is a Water-dependent Use Project.

Attached is the WRP's Public Notice form for this application. The Applicant is required to publish this notice, at his/her expense, in one or more newspapers having circulation in the area affected by the proposed activity. This notice must be published in the local newspaper(s) for at least one day on or before March 8, 2006, the designated Notification Date. The required public comment period shall begin on this designated Notification Date. The Applicant is required to submit proof of publication to the WRP by sending a copy of the newspaper notice showing the date of publication or a copy of the newspaper notice and a letter from the newspaper indicating the date the public notice was published.

Pursuant to 310 CMR 9.13(1)(a), the Applicant is also required to concurrently provide this notification, along with a copy of the project site plans submitted with the Waterways License Application, to the appropriate municipal officials and abutters to the project for their review and comment (see Notification mailing list attached). For Chapter 91 purposes, an abutter is defined as the owner of land that shares a common boundary or corner with a project site at the water's edge, as well as the owner of land that lies within 50' across a waterbody from such site, see; 310 CMR 9.02. The WRP will publish the Public Notice in *The Environmental Monitor*.

Public notice is hereby given of the Waterways application by Boston Tea Party Ship, Inc. to reconstruct and expand the existing Boston Tea Party Ship & Museum on the Congress Street Bridge in the municipality of Boston in and over Flowed Tidelands of the Fort Point Channel. The proposed uses are for museum, and associated retail, restaurant, storage, office and public access purposes. The proposed uses have been determined to be a mix of water-dependent and accessory to water-dependent uses.

The Department of Environmental Protection, Waterways Regulation Program, will conduct a public hearing on the aforesaid project proposal on Friday March 24, 2006, at 3:00 p.m. in the DEP Office at One Winter Street, Boston. The Department will conduct this public hearing in order to receive information to be used in its decision on whether to grant a Waterways License pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 91.

The Department will consider all written comments on this Waterways application received by Monday April 10, 2006 (the Public Comments Deadline). Failure of any aggrieved person or group of ten citizens or more to submit written comments to the Waterways Regulation Program by the Public Comments Deadline will result in the waiver of any right to an adjudicatory hearing in accordance with 310 CMR 9.13(4)(c).
