

NOTICE OF A REMEDIAL ACTION PLAN

Mobil Station No. 12258 (Formerly 01-335) 647 Lowell Street, Lexington, Massachusetts MADEP Site No. 3-1493 Tier IC No. W010008

A Remedial Action Plan (310 CMR 40.0861) has been developed for this site pursuant to the Massachusetts Contingency Plan (310 CMR 40.1406). This disposal site was granted a Waiver of Approvals in 1993. Upon expiration of the waiver, Tier II Extension requests were submitted to the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection in 1998 and 1999. During Phase II Comprehensive Site Assessment activities the site was reclassified as a Tier IC disposal site. The Tier IC Permit became effective on July 12, 2000.

The Remedial Action Plan (RAP) proposes the following measures to respond to a release of oil and/or hazardous material at this disposal site:

- Based upon a review of the available information, the Phase III RAP identified natural attenuation as the most effective remedial option for addressing groundwater impacts at the site characterized by volatile petroleum hydrocarbons, methyl tert-butyl ether and tetrachloroethene. The proposed option is technically feasible and has been successfully employed at similar sites in Massachusetts.
- ◆ The Phase III RAP also identified surfactant injection and recovery as the most effective remedial option for addressing groundwater impacts at the site characterized by extractable petroleum hydrocarbons and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons. The proposed option is technically feasible and has been successfully employed at similar sites in Massachusetts.

M.G.L. c. 21E and the Massachusetts Contingency Plan provide additional opportunities for public notice of and involvement in decisions regarding response actions at disposal sites: 1) The Chief Municipal Official and Board of Health of the community in which the site is located will be notified of major milestones and events, pursuant to 310 CMR 40.1403; and 2) Upon receipt of a petition from ten or more residents of the municipality in which the disposal site is located, or of a municipality potentially affected by a disposal site, a plan for involving the public in decisions regarding response actions at the site will be prepared and implemented, pursuant to 310 CMR 40.1405.
