Joint 401 WQC and Chapter 91 Public Notice
Notification Date: September 11, 2006

Pursuant to 33 U.S.C. 1341 and M.G.L. c. 21 §43, notice is given of a 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) application for Admiral's Hill Marina to perform maintenance dredging of approximately 2,100 cubic yards of sediments from the Island End River in Chelsea and Everett. The material will be disposed of at an approved upland site. Pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 91, 310 CMR 9.00 Admiral's Hill Marina, 100 Justin Drive, Chelsea, MA 02150 has also applied for a Dredge Permit to maintenance dredge at the marina. The proposed project has been determined to be water-dependent pursuant to 310 CMR 9.12(2)(a). Written comments on the 401 WQC must be sent within **twenty-one (21) days of the Notification Date to: Lealdon Langley, DEP Wetlands and Waterways Program, One Winter Street, 6th Floor, Boston, MA 02108.**

Written comments on the Chapter 91 Dredge Permit must be sent within **fifteen, (15) days of the Notification Date to: Ben Lynch, DEP Waterways Program, One Winter Street, 6th Floor, Boston, MA 02108.**

Any group of ten persons, any aggrieved person, or any governmental body or private organization with a mandate to protect the environment who submits written comments may appeal the Department's Certification and Dredge Permit. Failure to submit written comments before the end of the public comment period may result in the waiver of any right to an adjudicatory hearing.
