A small portion of the southern extent of the pathway coincides with the boundary of the Neponset River Estuary Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC). However, the work within this area is limited to the reconstruction of an existing roadway and sidewalk area. In addition, a small amount of the proposed work at Victory Park/Victory Road falls within the ACEC. The Victory Park work includes sidewalk extension and regrading of the parking lot to eliminate low spots and improve drainage. The gravel lot will not be paved. A small gravel area will be restored with loam and seed. The proposed work will improve public access to the Neponset Estuary, which is consistent with the goals of the Neponset River Estuary ACEC Resource Management Plan by providing public benefits, recreational opportunities, and protecting water quality.
